### PRE-BID VOLUNTARY WALK THRU

At Bid Opening the Contractor only needs to include the BID, and BID BOND in the bid packet. The low bidder will be expected to produce the balance of the 4 forms upon demand. Including additional paper work on the day of bidding only slows up the bid process. A bid will not be thrown out if the additional paper work is included but is unnecessary the day of the bid.

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THE VILLAGE REQUIRES TWO APPROVED WATER SAMPLES FROM ALL SAMPLING POINTS. The board is aware that IEPA only requires one sample. All water main installed is to be pigged.

### WAGE RATES

The current updated wage rates are enclosed and supersede the wage rates included in the specifications.

### SPECIFICATIONS:

#### Section 84 – TELEMETRY

- Section 84.01 – A. General – The third paragraph shall be deleted and in its place the following shall replace the deleted paragraph:  
“The SCADA improvements shall be part of this contract except for the part of the controls from the interface panel to and including the

Fountain RTU/SCADA as shown on drawing number 9. This contract shall include all work to provide and place in operation the PLC and interface panel as shown in the PLC/RTU SCADA Schematic on drawing number 9. The provider of the PLC and interface panel shall coordinate with the Fountain SCADA provider what is required to enable the Fountain Water District SCADA provider the ability to use the signals shown on the schematic on drawing number 9. The PLC shall allow the operator to interface with the Maeystown system via either a lap top or a smart phone. As shown on the drawing the PLC provider shall include the laptop, all software required and the smart phone along with a one year plan (Minimum) to allow the operator to receive the data. The Fountain RTU/SCADA, laptop, smart phone and wiring from the fountain side of the interface panel is not part of this contract and will be covered by a separate construction contract with Fountain Water District's existing SCADA contractor.”

- B. – Specified System – First paragraph, the requirement that the equipment shall be manufactured by a single supplier means that the Maeystown part of the system covered by this contract shall be **SUPPLIED BY A SINGLE SUPPLIER**. The Fountain part of the controls can be by a different supplier. The equipment may be by different manufacturers as long as a single supplier assembles the operating system.
- The second paragraph and the third paragraph of section B are hereby deleted.

## DRAWINGS:

### DRAWING SHEET #2

- The 4” drain line shall have a eight (8’) foot diameter manhole by eight foot deep (2 – 4 foot sections) with a flat top manhole cover with a 18” diameter metal manhole lid cast into the cover installed approximately twenty feet (plus or minus) south of the south wall of the master meter building. The manhole shall have an open bottom (no base required) and shall be filled with washed clean rock. This manhole will function as a dry well to accept the drain waste from the master meter building. The dry well will have an over flow line running to the exposed outlet as shown on the drawings. The drain line shall run as shown on the drawings and shall dump into the eight foot manhole. The overflow shall run out of the manhole in the same location as shown on the drawings.

### DRAWING SHEET #3



- Item number six in the legend should read “ALTITUDE VALVE – 3”, FOR ONE-WAY FLOW TO BE a FLOW-TEK ADVANCED V-CONTROL BALL VALVE W/ELECTRIC CONTROLS”. Section 64.03, subsection L titled “ALTITUDE VVALE”, Page 64-10 of the specifications is correct. As a result items number 7 and 8 in the legend and shown on the drawing are eliminated. The altitude control valve does not require an orifice plate and sensing line. Both item number 7 and 8 are deleted.
- An additional two inch tap and 2” gate valve shall be added to the water line near the elbow after passing through the chemical injection points to feed the make-up/wash down line that is shown the flow schematic on sheet 9.
- The existing line size shown in the sample line pit detail should be 8” instead of 6”. The sample line should be reduced in the pit to ¼” instead of the 1” line as shown on the detail.

#### DRAWING SHEET #4;

- Note on the “Building section” for the metal roof shall be revised to read, “METAL ROOF (COLOR PER OWNER) 24 GA. STANDING SEAM RIB PANEL (24 IN WIDE), BUT PANELS WIDTH’S LESS THEN 24” ARE ALLOWED. THE ROOF PANELS SHALL BE ANCHORED TO THE 5/8” ROOF SHEATING UTILIZING METAL CLIPS.
- Exterior entrance doors shall be 1-3/4” thick, 3’-0” x 6’-8”, 16 gauge steel tubular core with 0.5 Lbs/cf fiberglass batting insulation. Each door is to include a 12 gauge steel plate closure reinforcement. Hinges shall be five knuckle full mortise bearing hinges and shall utilize non-ferrous, non-removable pin (NRP) hinges. Exterior locks shall be mortise type with 1” throw dead-bolt and LNL rose/lever design. Door pulls/locks shall be a simplex keyway keyed alike and shall include six (6) keys. All lock sets are to be keyed to a registered factory system.

#### DRAWING SHEET #6;

- The note stating “REROOF EXISTING TREATMENT PLANT” shall be deleted. The existing plant is not to be reroofed.
- The existing line size shown in the sample line pit detail should be 8” instead of 6”. The sample line should be reduced in the pit to ¼” instead of the 1” line as shown on the detail.

#### DRAWING SHEET #8

- The existing meter and the existing disconnect shown on the electrical schematic located on the right half of drawing shall be changed to read “PROPOSED METER

BASE” and “PROPOSED DISCONNECT”. The existing meter service will remain until the new service as shown on the “Electrical Service Detail” is completed.

- In addition to the meter base and the disconnect the electrical schematic is incorrect in the breaker feed to the existing bulk water salesman building. The feed is a 240 volt feed thus the feed has to be from both “L1” and “L2”.

#### DRAWING SHEET #9

- Flow Schematic located on the top of the drawing has two items that are incorrect. The existing water line running through the existing altitude valve box is an 8” line instead of a 6” line as shown. The site plan shown on sheet 2 is correct. Also the reduced line shown in the “Meter Room should be 3” instead of 2” as shown. This makes the electric altitude valve and the water meter with strainer 3” in size. The piping details on sheet 3 are correct.

#### GENERAL INFORMATION;

- Three four (4’) foot surface mount led lights shall be installed in both the chemical room and the meter room for a total of six (6) four foot surface mount LED twin bulb lights. Each light fixture shall have a minimum of 5000 lumens, neutral white, and 50W output. All three lights in each room shall be controlled via a single switch located near the entry door of each room. One exterior surface mount LED light shall be mounted under the porch center in front of the meter room door. The exterior surface mount LED light shall have a minimum of 1000 Lumens, neutral white, 14 watt output.

Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

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The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

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Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.
